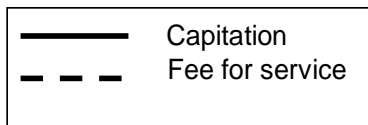
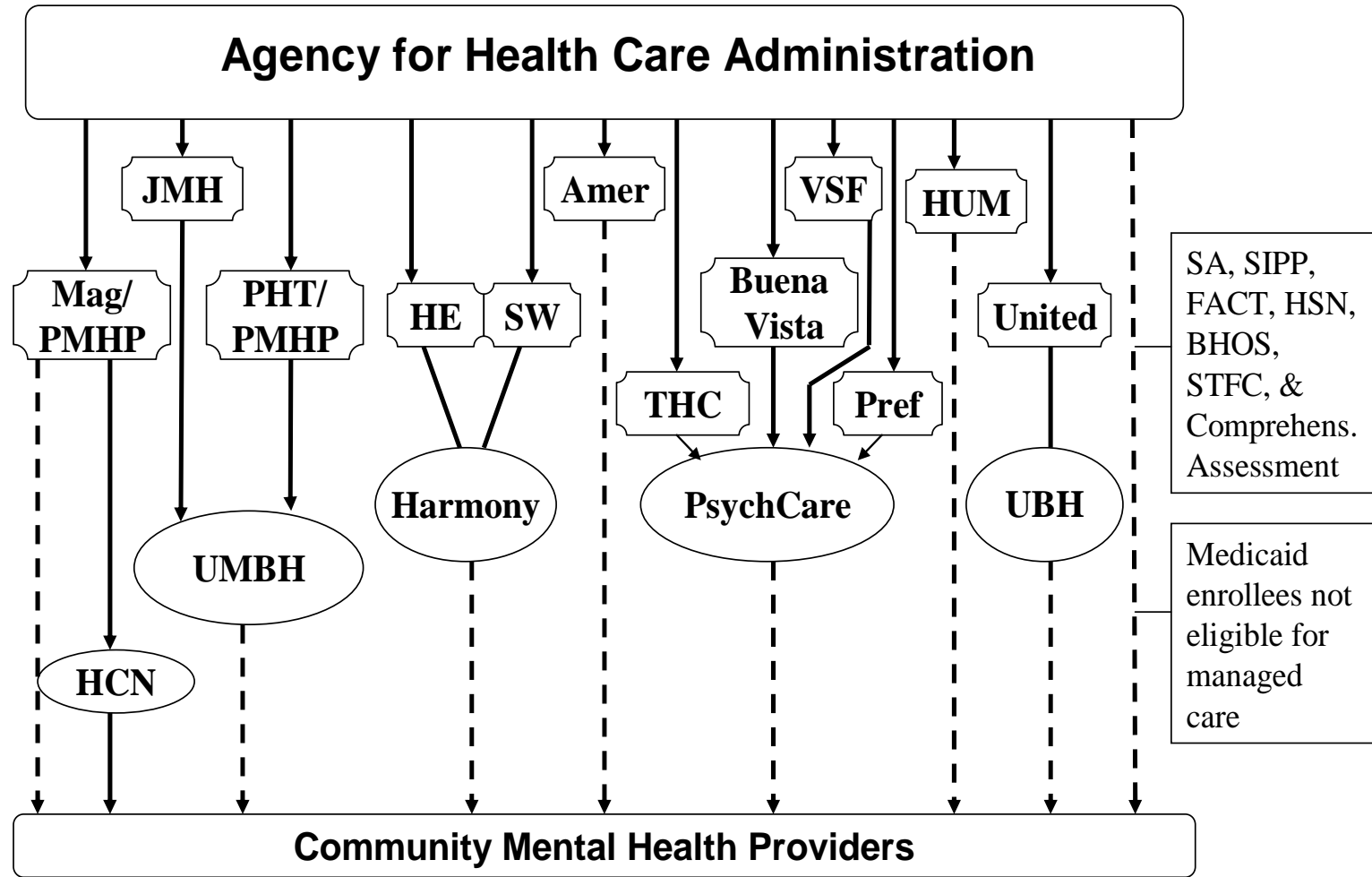


# Medicaid Financing Strategies for Physical Health & Mental Health



\*Areas 10 and parts of Area 4 are exempt due to Reform

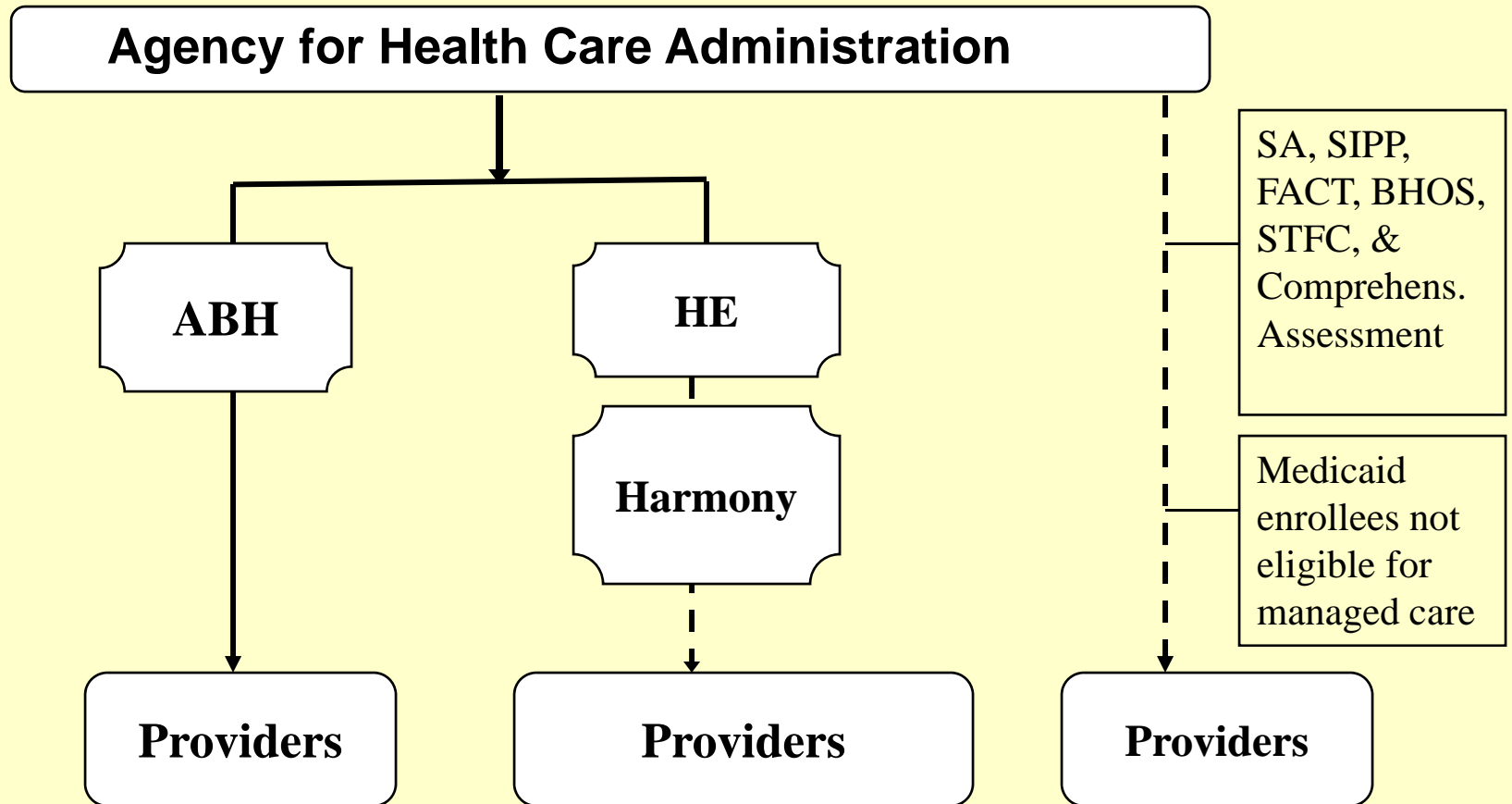
\*\*Began 7/1/06, PSNs are paid FFS for 3 years. HMOs are capitated.

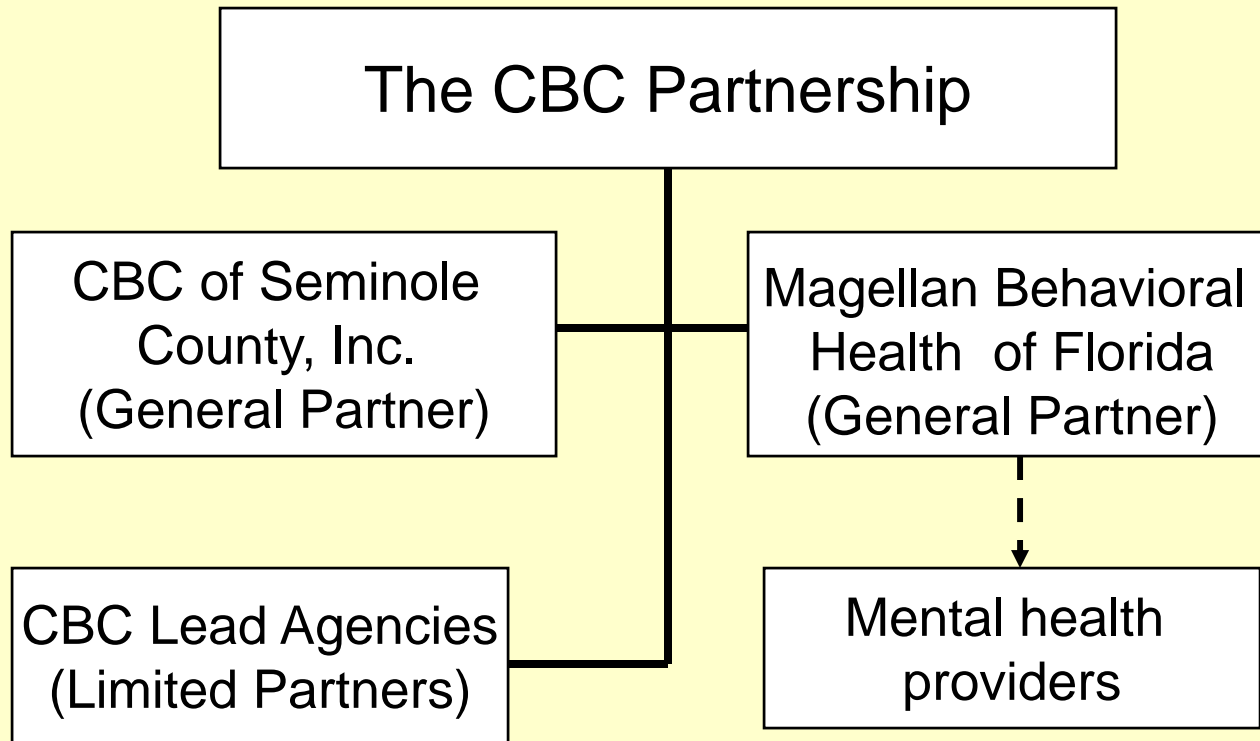
# Medicaid Funding Streams

- Cost containment?
- Improved Outcomes?

# Summary Observations

- **Access**
  - Penetration rates remain flat
  - Access to medications problematic for HMO enrollees
- **Cost**
  - Effective Cost Containment for Medicaid
- **Outcomes**
  - Modest Outcome Differences

# Successes & Continuing Challenges

- **Successes**
  - Waiting for services reduced or eliminated
  - Flexibility in service delivery under capitation
  - Cost containment for Medicaid
  - Improved opportunity for choice
- **Continuing Challenges**
  - Transitional disruptions
  - Data integrity
  - Improved Access
  - Service innovation
  - Service integration, especially with health
  - Continuity of care
  - Move to recovery, family & consumer involvement
